SUNDAY BRUNCH BUFFET: FEATURING—Carving station (various meats); chilled shrimp platters (plain or spicy); various hot entrees (meats, pasta, potatoes, vegetables, etc.); soup & salad bar; Belgium waffle station with toppings; breakfast items (bacon, sausage, sweet rolls, breads, fruit, etc.); desserts (cakes, pies, etc.); and chocolate fountain.

BAR: Cash, located outside the dining room.

TIME: Seating will begin at **2:15 PM** since the same room is used for their regular brunch. A waiting area with seating is available just outside the dining room if you come early and are waiting to be seated.

DIRECTIONS: Take RT 31 east towards Somerset. Turn into Hidden Valley Resort at the sign (it's about 22 miles from Norvelt—about 35 minutes) and proceed into the resort on the main road for about ½ mile. Go past the main lodge on the left and the realty office on the right for another few hundred yards. The road will split. **Bear left.** You'll be able to see a large gray, two-story building in the distance at the bottom of the ski slopes. Take the road to the building as you make a semi-circle. You can park at the lower (best) or upper level parking lots. The Clocktower Restaurant is located on the second floor. You can walk to it from the steps on the right, or you can use the elevator located inside on the left of the hallway at the lower level. Take the elevator to the 2nd floor. The room is located on the left as you exit the elevator.
